



Memorandum of Understanding between Australian Society for Concrete Pavements and International Society for Concrete Pavements

The International Society for Concrete Pavements (ISCP) and the Australian Society for Concrete Pavements (ASCP), hereafter referred to as "the parties", desiring to strengthen their relationship and provide mutual support in their missions related to facilitating the advancement of knowledge and technology related to concrete pavements through education, technology transfer and research, enter into this revised Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) effective 27 August 2024.

The purpose of this MoU between ISCP and ASCP is to encourage collaboration and cooperation between the parties, and to avoid technical duplication wherever and whenever possible.

Neither party may use the other's name in a way that would imply endorsement of its technical reports or publications unless that publication has been reviewed and approved in writing for use as a joint publication.

The parties agree to formally review this MoU from time to time to ensure that it meets its stated goals.

This MoU shall remain in effect until such time as one or the other party requests its termination, normally giving 90 days written notice in order to hold discussions about termination and as a courtesy.

Cooperative Efforts

The parties agree to the following cooperative efforts in order to meet the stated purpose of this MoU:

- 1. Visits by each parties officers, staff or members to the other parties headquarters and membership meetings are encouraged.
- 2. ASCP will encourage its members to join ISCP. ASCP has an option to join ISCP as an organization member.
- 3. Each party will have the right to promote this MoU on its website, letterhead and other materials.
- 4. Each party will, to the best of its abilities at the time, provide support for the other party's activities and programs when requested, including publicizing those activities and programs on its web site.





- 5. The parties will provide one complimentary copy of their conference proceedings and electronic newsletters to each other's Executive Officer/Secretary. Information from the electronic newsletters may be conveyed to the other party's members upon written agreement.
- 6. The parties agree to conduct joint seminars/symposia/workshops from time to time. Such events, and any specific terms and conditions, are to be agreed upon specifically for each event.
- 7. When technical assistance is requested by one party, the other party will make its best effort to provide assistance by communicating the issue to its qualified members and partners (i.e., industry specialists and stakeholders), soliciting input, and by providing a formal response or contact name for the first party to discuss the issue with in more detail in an effort to resolve the matter.

Particular Terms

The parties agree to the following collaborative efforts between ISCP International Conference on Concrete Pavements (ICCP) and ASCP Conference

- ISCP and ASCP consider the accomplishment of their respective International and National Conferences as opportunities to review new developments in the design, construction, maintenance and management of concrete pavements.
- The parties will provide one complimentary registration and acceptance of the other party's recent best conference paper to be presented to each other's respective Conference for the purposes of international technical exchanges. The delegate receiving the complimentary registration be a member in good standing with their respective organization.
- 3. As part of the cooperative efforts described previously, ISCP will help to publicize and promote each ASCP Conference, and the ISCP logo (or a listing of ISCP as a Conference Collaborator) will appear in all official documentation relating to each ASCP Conference.
- 4. As part of the cooperative efforts described previously, ASCP will help to publicize and promote each ISCP International Conference on Concrete Pavements (ICCP), and the ASCP logo (or a listing of ASCP as a Conference Collaborator) will appear in all official documentation relating to each ICCP.
- 5. ISCP will not have any economic responsibility regarding the organization, development and results of the ASCP Conferences.
- 6. ASCP will not have any economic responsibility regarding the organization, development and results of each ISCP ICCP.

Execution

- 1. This Memorandum shall take effect upon its signing by authorized representatives of each organization.
- 2. This Memorandum may be amended by mutual agreement of the parties and will remain in effect until terminated by either party upon ninety (90) days' advance written notice to the other.





- 3. The parties agree that this MoU will be reviewed and modified or reapproved, as appropriate, within 5 years of the date of execution to ensure that it meets its stated goals. Failure to modify or reapprove the MoU within the stated period will result in the sunsetting of the MoU. 1st MoU signed 17 August 2009. 2nd MoU signed 15 April 2016
- 4. Nothing herein will create any joint venture, partnership or other business association, nor shall either party enter into any obligation or commitment on behalf of the other.
